### **How to Lobby Successfully in Brussels**

At the UECNA Annual General Meeting in March there will be a talk from an expert on the best way to lobby the European Commission and the European Parliament. The meeting is open to everybody. You do not need to be a member of UECNA to attend. Frank Schwalba-Hoth has agreed to address the meeting. He is one of the most experienced lobbyists in Brussels. He was a founder of the German Greens and an MEP from 1984 to 1987. Since he left the European Parliament he has been a consultant in Brussels. In 2011 he published the EU Stakeholder Directory, "a 900 page print and online directory of who's who and what's where in Brussels".

## 2012: A Sea of Protest across Europe

**Frankfurt:** Since the 4<sup>th</sup> runway opened in October 2011, up to 5,000 residents have occupied the terminal every Monday evening in protest against the impact of the new flight paths, with larger protests taking place on many weekends. So far, the campaigners have gained a partial ban on night flights and a promise of a reduction of day-time flights on the new runway. They also got rid of the Mayor of Frankfurt at last year's election. She was replaced by a Mayor who supports the campaigners. They aim to influence the regional and national elections in Germany later this year.

**Berlin:** Thousands of people have taken to the streets in protest against the proposed new airport on the outskirts of the city. The opening of the new airport has been much-delayed.

**Nantes:** The long-running battle against a new airport at Nantes in SW France captured the international headlines during the recent presidential election when farmers went on a 28 day hunger strike in protest against the seizure of their land. Since then there have been battles in the countryside as armed police have used tear-gas to try to remove people living in houses on the route of the planned new runway. The protest has made headline news across France. There are signs that the Government is feeling the pressure. It has offered talks with the protestors. But the campaigners have said that they will only agree to talk if the police are removed from the countryside and the talks include the possibility of the plans for the new airport being scrapped.

**Vienna:** Campaigners are still fighting to stop a third runway at Vienna. The airport proposed a deal with the residents. They proposed that they would reduce the noise over parts of the city in return for a third runway. Some of the residents agreed to the deal but others have continued to oppose the proposed runway.

**Ciampino:** As we reported in the last issue of *Exchange* aircraft noise has become a major problem for residents at Ciampino Airport in Rome since Ryanair started using the airport a few years ago. Many communities live very close to the airport. The residents are campaigning to cut the number of flights using the airport.

#### A 3<sup>rd</sup> runway in Munich

The 3<sup>rd</sup> runway was stopped in its tracks when the citizens of Munich voted against it in a city-wide referendum following high-profile protests.

#### A new airport in Siena

Plans for a new airport near Siena in the beautiful Tuscan countryside of North Italy were defeated after a long campaign by local people.

#### A new airport in Viterbo

Plans for a new airport at the Viterbo Air Force Base, some 40 miles north west of Rome, were dropped following a campaign involving academics, many social movements and environmental and human rights groups.

## Night Flight Experiment at Heathrow

HACAN, the campaigning organisation which represents residents under the Heathrow flight paths, has worked with the airport owner, Heathrow Airport, on an experiment to give communities some relief from night flights. Parts of the airspace over London have been divided up into boxes. The boxes are 'no fly' zones. It means that every second week people living in the boxes will get no flights until nearly 06.00.
